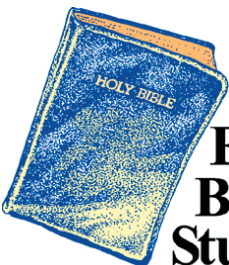

Bible Study

The Bible Study, which was postponed from last Thursday, will continue our study of Mark. We will be concentrating upon the first phase of Jesus' Ministry, chapters 1:14-6:6. Here are some questions to consider:



Effective Bible Study

- 1) What did Jesus preach about when he began his ministry?
- 2) In what area of the country did Jesus begin his ministry?
- 3) Very early in his ministry, Jesus healed a man on the Sabbath and in the synagogue (1:21-28). This angered the Pharisees. Why

do you think such anger was aroused within the Pharisees?

4) What kind of argument did the Pharisees and Scribes against Jesus's ability to cast out demons in 3:20-30?

5) The parable of the sower (4:1-9) is one of the few parables for which we have Jesus' explanation. What does his explanation mean to you?

6) How would you have felt if you saw someone stop the wind from blowing during a storm?

7) In the final verses of this section, Jesus is rejected in his hometown and cannot perform many works of power because of the unbelief of those living there. This says that belief is an important ingredient in the reality of miracles. What would it take for you to have belief that miracles can occur?
